Opening +

Silence is held.

May the God of all nations embrace *community/this block/neighborhood/town/nation* deeply in this moment, and grant healing and comfort that spans time, distance, loss, and all injury. Amen.

Naming

In this location, name(s) was taken. *He/she/they* lived here, stood here, passed by here. Name(s) was part of this *community* and in recent days, *they* were removed from this *community*.

Silence is held.

Jesus Christ, the Son of God, healed many as a sign that God's reign was near. He sent the disciples to continue this work of healing—with prayer, the laying on of hands, and anointing. God used the hands and feet of his disciples to carry Jesus' healing acts through all of time. In the name of Christ, whose healing power remains strong today, we now entrust to God's healing power name(s) and this *community*.

A reading from Isaiah 43:

¹But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name; you are mine. ²When you pass through the waters, I will be with you, and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. ³For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior.
