

Prepare to Pass Your Naturalization Interview & Test



If you applied for naturalization (Form N-400) on or after October 20, 2025, prepare for your application processing, interview with U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS), and the new 2025 Naturalization Civics Test.

What Is Changing?

- New and additional civics test questions
- More rigorous reviews of disability exceptions to the English and civics requirements
- Good moral character assessment will now look for positive contributions to American society
- Neighborhood investigations

Who Will Be Affected?

Anyone who has applied or is planning to apply for U.S. citizenship through the naturalization process should stay informed about policy changes that may impact your application process.

Thousands of applicants achieve their dream of citizenship every year. With the right information and preparation, you can too.

- Preparing for your application review and interview will help you know what to do when you or someone you know is asked questions about your application.
- Studying with the correct materials is essential to passing the test and becoming a U.S. citizen.
